Shared Inquiry Questions: Term 3 2024

English Guiding Question

How can we communicate effectively and with impact?

Skills and Concepts

We will explore:

- language features including topic-specific vocabulary;
- literary devices, and/or multimodal features and features of voice;
- ways to create written and multimodal texts, for particular purposes and audiences; and
- developing and expanding on ideas using supporting details.

KEY QUESTION

How do we connect globally? What is my impact?



Mathematics Guiding Question

What impact does Maths have in our lives?

Skills and Concepts

We will explore:

- how to critique arguments presented in the media based on statistics;
- how we can check the reasonableness of calculations using estimation;
- how we can use mathematical modelling to solve financial and other practical problems; and
- situations in which fractions affect our daily lives.

Science Guiding Question

How can fair testing and the analysis of evidence be used to inquire into the nature of matter?

Skills and Concepts

- observations;
- classification of substances and their changes;
- predicting and explaining the observations we make; and
- conducting fair tests to investigate chemical phenomena.

The Arts Guiding Question

When is creative work ready to share?

Skills and Concepts

- creating and curating a range of artistic works;
- interpreting and explaining why we have chosen them; and
- reading and playing notated music.

Japanese Guiding Question

How do people purchase goods and services in Japan?

Skills and Concepts

- recognising and applying the Japanese number system and currency values;
- appraising consumer decisions based on their impact; and
- applying Japanese language for selling and purchasing products in Japanese.

Humanities And Social Sciences Guiding Question

What influences have people had on places, locally and globally?

Skills and Concepts

- locating, collecting and organising information from primary and secondary sources;
- exploring the influence of people on the characteristics of places; and
- evaluating sources to determine origin, purpose and perspectives.

Country as teacher Guiding Question

What is the connection between the natural and built environment, communities and culture?

Skills and Concepts

We will:

- explore the ways that culture can be a way of expressing the connection between communities and the natural environment; and
- research the ways that communities care for the natural environment.

Health and Physical Education Guiding Question

What strategies can be used to promote physical activity participation that enhance health, fitness and wellbeing?

Skills and Concepts

We will demonstrate our:
